## The Pastor's Pen

Lisa has once again reminded me (though I think it is a polite demand) that it is time for my newsletter article. As I was struggling with what to share with you this month, the thought came that we might do a little time traveling. No, I have not lost my mind nor am I about to engage in some science fiction writing. You see, back during 2020 when Covid had everything shut down, I sent out devotional emails to my congregation once or twice a week. I want to share one with you:

Dear Church Family,

As I sit here this morning thinking about what to share with you, I am struggling to be patient. Leland wanted to accompany me to the office, which was fine as he has schoolwork to do on his Chromebook. However, he keeps interrupting me asking for help. He wants me to "help" him with his work [by which he means do it for him]. Finally, after resisting his appeals for several minutes, I am able to get some work done. He is working, though with periodic questions about how to spell something.

Why am I sharing this? Am I confessing my lack of patience? No, but I probably should! I'm sharing because in the midst of telling him to do it on his own, I felt one of those mental nudges. "Is this how God feels? Does God sometimes 'resist' our prayers?"

You know, of course, that the reason I was reluctant to help Leland was not because I didn't love him, but because he needs to learn for himself. Doing it for him would not really be helping him. He is capable of doing the work for the most part, and once he was working I was more than willing to give him a hand over some difficult spots.

I wonder, if in the same way God sometimes doesn't answer our prayers? Knowing that we are capable, that we don't need as much help as we think we do, God waits for us to show some initiative and then along the way gives us assistance. Now, I am not saying this explains all unanswered prayer, but perhaps some.

A few moments ago Leland interrupted again, but this time it was not to ask for help. "Look, Dad, see how fast I am typing." A moment of accomplishment that resulted from my not helping.

The next time you are waiting for God to answer a prayer ask yourself this: "What is God waiting for me to do? Am I asking for help when God is saying 'Start by helping yourself'?"

May God answer/not answer your prayers!

Our first Casserole Drive was on July 9th and was very successful. Our freezer is 80% full and we have taken several meals to our sick members already. Thank you for the generous donations of food and money.

The first organization's meeting was held last week and we had 11 people in attendance and 6 additional volunteers who expressed their desire to help. At this meeting, we decided to have a Casserole Drive on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of every 2<sup>nd</sup> month. The next Casserole Drive will be on September 24, 2023.
