The Pastor's Pen

Matthew 18

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" 2He called a child, whom he put among them, 3and said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Yesterday I was driving around and wondering what to give Lisa for the newsletter. [Seems like every week she is asking me for another Pastor's Pen.] So I was driving around, hoping for some kind of inspiration. Then, I saw a small airplane that seemed to be headed for the Spartanburg airport, but maybe not. Thank you, Lord, for answering my prayer.

When I saw the plane, I had several thoughts, seemingly all at once: "I wonder where that plane is going?" "Where has it been?" "I wish I could fly a plane." "What was the name of that book I read when I was a kid about the American pilots in France during World War I?" (You know how it is when your mind wanders.) And then, "Bernoulli's Principle."

Have you ever flown? Have you ever looked out the plane window at the wing and wondered, "How does the wing lift the airplane off the ground?" The answer to that question is Bernoulli's Principle. Let me offer a brief and simplified explanation.

Notice in the picture of the wing the top edge is curved. The absolute distance from the front of the wing to the back edge is the same, but the path over the top of the wing is longer. The molecules that move above the wing are forced to move faster relative to the wing surface than those below the wing because the ones above are traveling a longer path. This causes a reduction in pressure above the wing and thus produces lift.

"Why in the world is Jeremy rambling on about airplanes and how they fly?" Because it occurs to me that we are like an airplane wing. Or, perhaps, we are more like potential airplane wings as in this image. Imagine this as our wing. Will it fly? No, because the air speed and pressure are the same above and below. If we want it to fly, we will have to add some curve.

The same is true for our spiritual lives. I don't know how many people tell me that they don't like change. They want things to just stay the same. But Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change..." We have to be willing to let change into our lives. We have to add some curve.

What kinds of things can we do to add curve to our lives? First and foremost we can add prayer. We talk about praying a great deal, but how much time to we actually spend in prayer each day. If we were asked to answer truthfully how many minutes we pray each day, would the answer embarrass us?

We add curve when we stretch ourselves to do more for other people. When we give a time and effort to easing someone else's burden.


We add curve when we trust in God and give up our worries. I didn't finish the quote earlier. "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children." Does Jesus mean that we should be childish and immature? No, He is saying that we must have faith as children do. We must trust in God's love and care as a little children trust their parents.

Now, the reason that seeing that small plane was the answer to my prayer? Let me ask you this: What happens when we add some curve? When we add it to the wing, we get lift. The same is true for our spiritual lives. As we add the curve, God will lift us up. So, if you are feeling a little flat, if your life has you down, then I say to you, "Add some curve!"

"And God will raise you up, on eagle's wings....."
